#### **Repeater News**

Kevin has been experimenting with an 'anti-kerchunking' feature built into our repeater controllers. This feature requires a two second keydown before the reset tone will be heard. Shorter transmissions are immediately repeated so there is no need to key up for two seconds to be heard immediately.

A reminder: If you are using a crossband repeater to access the LRA repeaters, please carefully monitor it and protect it from accidental use by setting up PL tones other than the ones used by the repeaters.

Allstar users: don't forget to shut off all unused links before using the repeater.








Jeff, KC9JOB with

Hello Everyone,

You are invited to participate in the W1AW/9 operation for Wisconsin. You must be an ARRL member. Wisconsin's operating period is July 12th through July 18th! You must register and be approved to operate. Please let your friends and club know about this opportunity and invite them.

We are allowed one station per mode (SSB, CW and Digital) at a time, so up to three stations per band at once. There will be a lot of operating time available. WARC bands on HF are excluded.
