### **Taste of Field Day**



After the festivities at the park concluded, many of our members continued late into the night and the next day. By my count, over 500 SSB and CW QSOs were logged using the new club stations in Raymond and North Carolina.

## Project North Star is ON THE AIR! Access applications now available

Users are lining up to use the new LRA remote stations. We're ready to start accepting applications to join. Beta testing is over and while there may still be a few hiccups along the way, we'll handle them as they arise. The time to join up is NOW!

There is a one-time \$50 registration fee (waived for the GoFundMe donors) and monthly participation fees are waived until the end of 2025. Only LRA members may participate. Participants should join the ProjectNorthStar group in <u>Groups.IO</u> as important operating notes will be posted there and only there.

We will be reviewing the costs for participating in 2026 and beyond at a later date.

Our most successful fundraiser ever raised \$3550 towards equipment purchases. Membership unanimously approved the construction of our very own HF station at the April general meeting. Two radio stations are already on line, and two new towers are up just waiting for their antennas. When completed, we'll be adding a third radio connected to a multi-band beam and rotor system up 55 feet!

While the weekend weather didn't allow us to install the beam antenna on the main tower in June, we should be able to get that operational by the end of July. We've had reports of QSOs from Raymond on 80/40/30/20/17/15/12/10 and even 6 meters! The Gap Titan is working well. Ten more feet on tower #1 and we're adding the second site radio and the big beam.

Bylaw changes are intentionally drawn out affairs, so while this may be presented at the next meeting, a final vote may still be further down the line.

<<IMPORTANT>> We have upgraded the system software to 3.9.18 on Wednesday, June 4. Users must install SmartSDR v 3.9.18 on their PCs after the upgrade. PREVIOUS VERSIONS WILL NO LONGER WORK. If you receive a warning that prompts you to upgrade or downgrade the radios, please do not do so. It means that you are not running the correct version of the software on your PC.

Be sure to read K9WBT's operating instructions found on the ProjectNorthStar <u>Groups.IO</u> page.

Software is free and may be downloaded <u>HERE</u> (https://www.flexradio.com/software/smartsdr-v3-9-18/)

Users should all be enrolled in the Project North Star <u>groups.io</u> forum. We will make all system announcements there. Search <u>groups.io</u> or contact me at <u>VP@KR9RK.COM</u> for an invite. This forum will be used for system operational announcements only and not for casual conversation.



#### **K9SO Annual Gaian Eclipse party.**

**What is a Gaian Eclipse?** When the sun goes behind the moon, we call it a solar eclipse. When the moon passes into Earth's shadow, it's a lunar eclipse.

But there's a third, far more mysterious phenomenon: the *Gaian Eclipse*. This momentous event occurs when we—humble inhabitants clinging to the daylight side of Earth—suddenly are plunged into the planet's own shadow.

During a Gaian Eclipse, the Earth perfectly aligns between you and the sun, completely blocking its light from your view. And on July 19 near Charlotte, NC, this cosmic alignment will begin precisely at 8:37 p.m. local time. Totality will last approximately 10 hours.


Astrophysicists speculate (without any supporting evidence) that terrestrial HF radio propagation could be dramatically affected, with higher frequencies mysteriously falling silent—an effect previously observed every evening but now imbued with the majesty of a named event. You, too, can contribute to science by conducting rigorous experiments such as yelling "CQ!" into the ether and logging your QSOs (or lack thereof) during totality.

To commemorate this awe-inspiring celestial occurrence, I'm throwing a Gaian Eclipse Party at my home in North Carolina. After all, it's *an event so big, the whole Earth participates*. Attendance is mandatory—because unless you're on the ISS, you're already in the shadow.





#### In the News:

#### Steppir to end amateur antenna production

PAUL/ANCHOR: The popular amateur radio antennas manufactured by SteppIR are being discontinued. The company announced that it is halting their production this summer. Jim Damron N8TMW has the details.

JIM: SteppIR has announced that it is stopping production of all amateur radio and other consumer antennas starting in August. The company's statement, which appears on its website, said that it would continue to honor all product warranties and provide technical support as needed.

The company said: [quote] "Given our long history of impact and innovation we don't take this decision lightly but have decided that it is necessary for our ongoing operations and to make sure we can continue to efficiently provide our existing customers with product support services." [endquote]

All antenna and spare-parts orders will be fulfilled by the company through to the end of August. After the 31st of the month, SteppIR will sell spare parts as long as the inventory permits.

Based in Washington state, the company has been well-known in the amateur radio community since 2001. SteppIR produces a variety of mechanically adjusted, remotely tuned, frequency optimized HF/VHF Yagi, Vertical and Dipole antenna systems which serve military, commercial, emergency communications and consumer markets.




